Tenth Meeting of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Committee (STAC) of the Protocol Concerning Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW) in the Wider Caribbean Region

PROPOSAL BY THE FRENCH REPUBLIC ON SARGASSUM

PROPOSAL BY THE FRENCH REPUBLIC ON SARGASSUM

The Contracting Parties to the Cartagena Convention,

Considering the massive and recurrent strandings of pelagic *Sargassum algae* (*Sargassum fluitans and S. natans*) experienced since 2011 by several States in the Caribbean region;

Recognizing that the accumulation of algae on coastlines and their putrefaction constitute major health, economic and environmental challenges, leading to crisis situations and that, although the nuisances caused are poorly known scientifically or poorly quantified, they are certain and lead all the States of the Caribbean region affected to adopt, to the extent of their means, actions to combat them;

Considering the recommendations of COP 10 and the eighth meeting of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Committee (STAC 8) of the Protocol concerning Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW) in the wider Caribbean region;

Building in particular on the work carried out by the secretariat of the Convention and the Sargasses working group facilitated by RAC SPAW and presented at the ninth meeting of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Committee (STAC 9) of the Protocol concerning Specially Protected Areas and Wildlife (SPAW) in the wider Caribbean region, and on the 2021 Sargassum White Paper: "Turning the crisis into an opportunity", as well as on the strategies implemented by several contracting parties

Decide to:

- 1. Adopt the Sargassum Action Plan **as an annex** (essentially derived from the Sargassum Action Plan drawn up by the Secretariat and endorsed by the Sargassum WG which proposed it to STAC 9).
- 2. Mandate the Sargassum Working Group of the Cartagena Convention to carry out the following tasks:
 - Within six months of COP 12 scheduled for March 2023, have identified governance, within the Cartagena Convention, for the implementation of the future Sargassum action plan of the Convention;
 - Within six months of COP 12, have identified in this Sargassum action plan the actions to be carried out as a priority during the next biennium and those to be carried out later.
- 3. The Sargassum Working Group of the Cartagena Convention facilitated by RAC SPAW should include, as far as possible, representatives of the LBS Protocol and, where appropriate, the Secretariat.
- 3bis. Ask the Secretariat to send the relevant documents (action plan amended if necessary, governance proposals, prioritisation of actions, etc.) to the Contracting Parties for consultation and adoption. In the absence of opposition from the parties, these documents will be considered adopted. This consultation must be closed within nine months of COP12;
- 4. The actions identified in priority 1 must have been carried out or the necessary steps to achieve them (in the case of longer-term actions) must have been carried out within four months prior to STAC 11 of 2025.

ANNEX: SARGASSUM ACTION PLAN OF THE CARTAGENA CONVENTION

General objective:

Facilitate greater involvement of the Cartagena Convention (Secretariat, SPAW CAR...) in supporting Contracting Parties in responding to the challenges posed by Sargassum influxes and improving the management of their impacts in the Greater Caribbean Region.
